Leaving a child younger than seven in a vehicle without proper supervision (someone at least 12 years old) is considered a misdemeanor and in doing so endangers the child's health and safety. The state also considers leaving a child in a situation where physical or mental harm may take place (due to abuse or neglect) to be child endangerment.
